

- 8. What is the rhyming pattern in the song? ABAB or AABB, etc.

Activities

Create A Dinosaur

Model your favorite dinosaur using modeling clay or plastercene to create your own original design. Use recycled items (styrofoam, bottle caps, egg cartons, etc.) to make the feet, toes, teeth, etc. Give your dinosaur a name.

Dinosaur Collections

Bring your collection of dinosaurs to class. Separate them into three different categories: herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. You can then organize them into other categories including size and color.

3. Research

Research the period in which different species lived and discuss why they may have disappeared. Make a list of other animals which have become extinct or are presently endangered. Discuss how we can help keep them from becoming extinct.

4. Draw

Imagine what the world would be like today if dinosaurs were still alive! Draw a picture.

Create A Game Board.

It can be simple or complex. Materials needed include paper, colored pencils and dice. Draw a path on one large piece of paper or cardboard. Divide the path into small squares where each roll of the dice could land you. Print the directions on each square guiding the players to move forward or backward. Example: "Your dinosaur is caught in a crevasse - loose a turn" or "Your dinosaur has just sunk to the bottom of a tar pit - go back to start." or "Lush jungle with lots of food - advance 2 squares".

1. Chorus Actions

1,2,3,4,5,6,7 - place hand over hand in an upwards motion while counting. You can make it even more challenging if you slowly stand up while you're doing the actions.

7,6,5,4,3,2,1 - place hand over hand in a downwards motion while counting backwards

What's For Sale?

Create your own multi-level department store or tall building.
What would you find on each floor?

3. Let's Count

Choose four languages. Write and count to seven forwards and backwards in each language.

4. What A Crowd!

Put a hoola hoop on the floor (you can use a rope or anything else which can be formed into a closed shape) and see how many people can fit inside without stepping out. Now that's a crowded elevator!

5. Instruments In This Song

Ghost In The House

Activities

1. There's A Ghost!

Here's a little trick to have fun with ghosts. Draw a ghost on a piece of black paper. Cut it out, including the eyes and mouth. Glue the black ghost on a white piece of paper. Fix your eyes on the ghost while counting to forty. Now turn your head towards another wall. You will see an apparition...a white ghost which will slowly move across the room. Watch it until it disappears then close your eyes and it will reappear long enough to say goodbye! 1

Draw

Make a list of all the things you would like to blame on a ghost. Draw a ghost doing those things.

3. The Missing Object

Everybody gets a piece of paper and a pen. A table is set up with 5 items. Memorize the items. Everyone puts their heads on their desks until the teacher removes and hides one item. Write down the missing object. Those who get it right mark a checkmark by their answer and carry on to the next part of the game. The number of items are increased by one every time with one different item being removed and then returned on every round. Carry on until no one guesses the missing object. How many items will it take to confuse your memory. 7, 10, 15...more?

4. Did It Really Disappear?

Name an item you sometimes misplace. Example: Keys, brush, glasses, homework...etc. Pick one spot where you will always place the item when it is not with you.

See how long you can go without loosing it again.



5. ?????

You don't need to write this answer down. Keep it to yourself.

Has anyone ever taken anything from you? How did you feel? Have you ever taken anything that wasn't yours? How did you feel? How do you think the true owner felt? How would you change things if you could go back in time? If you were a ghost, what would you do to make life nice for someone?

Hey Mister Ice Cream Man - one hand waving

Build me a cone if you can - pretend to hold a cone in your other hand sing and lick

Well make it nine scoops high - hand over hand going higher and higher in front of you


So it can touch the sky - spread your hands apart high in the air making an arc

Flavor Graphic

Make a list of all the ice cream flavors you can think of. Pick your favorite flavor and represent it by drawing a scoop of ice cream. Once you have finished, put your drawing on the wall with everyone else's favorite scoop to create a graphic as in the example.



Analyze the graphic. Which flavor is the most popular? Which is the least popular? Survey another class. Compare the results.

Taste And Guess

While you are blindfolded, taste a spoonful of ice cream and try to guess the flavor.

4. Bizarre Flavors

Imagine bizarre flavors. Example: tomato, honey, chicken, etc. Make an advertisement to try and entice the public to buy the new ice cream flavors.

Rolling down the track - both hands in front of you rolling over each other in a
forward circular motion

2. All Aboard

Draw a train car or make one using cardboard or a shoe box. Draw or create freight/people who will travel on the train. Connect each train car together on the wall or on the floor to make a long train. Don't stop there! Make the country side and villages you may travel through. Your imagination is unlimited!


3. Modes of Transportation

4. Research

On the map supplied, print all the names of specific bodies of water you know.

Sea Animals

It's very exciting to swim in the sea. How many sea animals can you name?

Draw

If you could imagine an underwater city, what would it look like and what kinds of sea creatures would live there. Draw a picture.

Creative Dance

Think of other animals and how they move in their own special way. Create a dance with the movements.

Activities

Research

There are many different animals in this song. Where do they live? (jungle? ocean?) What countries would you find them in? Where do they spend a lot of their time? (In the water, on land or in the air?) What do they eat? What else do you know about them?

Animals

Write down the names of as many different animals as you can. Think of some of the actions you could do to identify with each animal. Create some new verses and fit them into the song.

Weird Creatures

It's your turn to create your own animals. Dream up some kind of creature and draw a picture of it in it's environment. What sound does it make? What does it eat? Think up some movements and fit them into the song.


4. Monkey Mirror

Choose a partner. Take turns leading your partner in this game. Stand facing each other three feet apart. Begin very slowly and try to copy the leaders actions. As you get used to the idea, you may increase the speed of the motions. Work together and become a team.

Instruments In This Song

Acoustic guitar, electric guitar, bass guitar, organ, congas, timbales, claves, cow bell, synthesizer keyboard and drums.

Listen for the animal sounds.





Activities

My Favorite Pizza

With the class make a list of all the possible ingredients on a pizza. Name your favorite ingredients. Each student draws one ingredient. Put them all together on a large paper pizza.

2. Delicious Fractions

Draw a pizza on the board and divide it into eight pieces. Apply these stories to the pieces.

John and Pat are about to eat the pizza. They will certainly each eat half the pizza. (Write the fraction $\frac{1}{2}$ on the board.) But the pizza is divided into eight pieces. How many pieces can they each eat? (4/8 is equal to $\frac{1}{2}$) This is what we call equivalent fractions.

John ate 2/8 of the pizza and Pat ate 3/8. Who ate the most? (3/8 is bigger than 2/8)

John ate one piece of the pizza. How do we represent this amount in a fraction? How many pieces are left? What is this fraction? Continue to eliminate the pieces to learn the fractions.

Is Pizza Good For Me?

Discuss the nutritional value of pizza. Classify the ingredients into their food groups. What food group do anchovies fit into?

4. Crossword Puzzle

On a piece of paper write down the word pepperoni. Using one of the letters in the word pepperoni, take turns finding words associated with pizza. Write down the new word. Use the letters in the new word to find more words associated with pizza. Keep adding the new words to your crossword puzzle. Example:

pepperoni

5. Pizza Order

Divide your class into small groups and choose vendors and buyers. Imagine a pizzeria. Create a name and a logo. Act out a pizza phone order. Use some of the following ideas in the conversation: What size pizza? What toppings would you like? How much does it cost? Will that be pickup or delivery? How much time will it take? You could also act out a restaurant scene with sit down customers.

Activities

1. You Are You!

Write out what makes you special/unique. List advantages and disadvantages of being big and small. What do you like best about yourself? What are the qualities that make people like to be with you? What makes you happy? What is your favorite fruit? What is your favorite song? What is your favorite activity? In what ways will you change as you get older? Notice how everyone mentions different things. Even if you're twins.

4. Baby Photo

Ask everyone in the class to bring baby pictures to school. Put them all up on the wall and try to guess who is who. Take turns telling funny stories about what happened to you when you were a baby.

Your Classmates

Write down one quality about each person in the class which makes them special.

Brainstorm

In small groups brainstorm for all the ways in which people are different. (nationality, language, skills, talents, etc.)

7. Strange World

Discuss how important it is to have people in all types of employment. Make a list of different jobs (occupations) that there are in the your community.

Imagine a world where everyone was the same. Describe this world as you see it.

8. Far, Far Away


Choose a foreign country. Research the lifestyle of a young person living there. Describe a typical day for them and compare it to a day in your life.

On a map of the world, locate the countries where people in your classroom/school/community originally came from. Ask these people to bring pictures of their countries of origin to school.



Walking In The Sun by Jake Chenier


Activities

1. Draw A Picture

Create a map of all the planets in our soar system and where they are situated in relation to the sun.

2. Build Your Own Galaxy

Create something out of this world using objects like balls, styrofoam, tin cans and other recycled materials. Cut a large thick piece of cardboard into an oval to use as your sky. Color it dark and paste or draw stars on it. You can even use glow in the dark materials. Hang thread or fishing line through tiny holes on the star side of the sky to hang your planets. Make similar planets to those in our system or create a galaxy of your own. Don't hold back! Reach for the stars!



3. Sun Facts

How can the sun be dangerous? List everything you know about that great ball of fire. What kinds of pollution can damage the ozone layer? Discuss ways of creating a healthier environment.

4. Safety First

List some of the ways you can play it safe in the sun.

5. One Sun Research

We have one sun for the whole planet. Discuss how it can be a sunny day in some parts of the world while it's night on the other side of the planet.




